







Hormonal IUD Training Resources

This guide provides an overview of globally-accessible, free hormonal IUD training resources, intended to complement country training plans or provide an introduction to the method for programs or countries considering adding hormonal IUD to their contraceptive method mix. These resources should not be considered a substitute for hands-on learning or context-specific didactic training of family planning providers.

General

Hormonal IUD Training Resource Package

The Hormonal IUD Training Resource Package (TRP) is a training curriculum intended to support health care workers in developing the knowledge, skills and attitudes needed to provide accurate information and counseling on hormonal IUDs to clients. The TRP can also be used to train qualified health care providers to insert and remove hormonal IUDs using both one-handed and two-handed inserters. The package's training sessions include PowerPoint presentations, skills practice in the form of role plays, case studies and discussions, as well as clinical practice, with anatomic models and clients, using objective competency-based skills checklists.

Hormonal IUD Digital Training

Originally developed by Society for Family Health Nigeria and Population Services International (PSI), the Hormonal IUD Digital Training is a technical, didactic training course on the hormonal IUD for health care providers. It includes 13 modules along with pre- and post-training knowledge assessments. The course is intended for providers who already have experience providing family planning counseling and methods to clients, and should complement inperson hands-on skill development. Mirena® SimulationOnline™ is an online training tool for the insertion and removal of Mirena® hormonal IUD, developed and sold by Bayer. The tool, which includes both didactic learning and the completion of guided and unguided insertion and removal simulations, is self-paced and provides the opportunity for unlimited practice until skills are mastered. Bayer provides a limited number of free, 1-year licenses to be used in low-resource countries. Access can be requested by completion a brief application form.
